2023-2024 Estimated Cost of Attendance and Financial Aid

Carey School of Law-MS Law Program

Applicants needing federal and institutional financial assistance to help with the cost of attending a school or program at UMB must complete the **Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**. Please note:

- Students must complete a FAFSA for every academic year they wish to receive assistance.
- USFA strongly encourages completing the FAFSA at studentaid.gov no later than March 1st for priority consideration. UMB School Code: **002104**
- The 2023-2024 FAFSA covers the 2023-2024 Academic Year (Summer 2023, Fall 2023 and Spring 2024).

Estimated Cost of Attendance

The Cost of Attendance (COA) is the maximum amount of financial assistance available to a student in one academic year. The COA listed covers the fall and spring semesters. Students who will also be enrolled in at least six (6) credits during the summer term will have their budget and awards adjusted based on the number of summer credits they are enrolled in.
